Just a friendly reminder that any residential property that hosts rent on a short term basis is a violation per City Housing Code - 69A-2: Gloucester Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the City Code, it shall be unlawful for an owner, lessor, sublessor, any other person(s) or entity(ies) with possessory or use right(s) in a dwelling unit, their principals, partner or shareholders, or their agents, employees, representatives and other person(s) or entity(ies), acting in concert or a combination thereof, to receive or obtain actual or anticipated consideration for soliciting, advertising, offering and/or permitting, allowing or failing to discontinue the use or occupancy of any dwelling unit, as defined herein, for a period of 30 days or less.

**Gloucester Town Corner** by Patrick Ward

8 December 1773. (250 years ago) - George the Third grants a Patent for the Town of Gloucester Although the Town of Gloucester had been in existence for at least 90 years prior, this document further defined the legal boundaries. The "Town of Gloucester" the legal name listed in the document, would have included present day communities of: Brooklawn, Mt. Ephraim, parts of Bellmawr and parts of Gloucester City. The original documents whereabouts is unknown, but the document is said to be signed by William Franklin, who was the last colonial Governor of New Jersey. William Franklin was of course Benjamin Franklin's son. Shortly after this patent was issued, Benjamin Franklin decided that America needed to break from the King. William Franklin would remain loyal to King George the Third and would be arrested in January of 1776.

Gloucester City is working for you! We have been working hard and have most recently received several grants:

- \$830,000 Green Acres Grant for repairs to the Park at Johnson Boulevard
- \$40,000 for tree planting from NJ Tree Foundation for trees planted on Chestnut Street, Oriental Avenue, and at the Johnson Boulevard park area. More trees this year on April 10th at Johnson Boulevard.
- \$358,000 for Community Project Funding from Congressman Donald Norcross for additional play area at Proprietors Park.
- \$1,100,000 combined grants for security cameras installed in all public areas. \$100,000 from UEZ allocation funds, \$200,000 from the state budget, and the remaining \$800,000 from the Community Project Funding program through Congressman Donald Norcross.
- \$100,000 from UEZ allocation funds for a public parking lot installed at 106 King Street.
- \$50,000 for a UEZ storage building to store events materials at Proprietors Park.
