ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PROPERTY

 - a. Preferred Gloucester Properties, LLC shall execute an agreement of sale prepared by the Gloucester City Solicitor, the cost of \$250.00, shall be borne by Preferred Gloucester Properties LLC;
 - b. The property is being sold in "as is" conditions and Gloucester City makes no warranties' other than it has the right to sell the property;
 - c. Preferred Gloucester Properties shall indemnify Gloucester City for any and all claims asserted after the sale;
 - d. Preferred Gloucester Properties has represented that the intended use of the property is as a courtyard for its adjacent property located at 937 Jersey Avenue;
 - e. The solicitor for the City of Gloucester shall prepare the deed and other conveyance documents, the cost of which, \$750.00, shall be borne by Preferred Gloucester Properties LLC;
 - f. Settlement shall take place within thirty (30) days of the adoption of this ordinance.

- g. Preferred Gloucester Properties LLC shall provide Gloucester City with a title report, containing the recital of how Gloucester City acquired title and the legal description of the property.
- h. Gloucester City shall bear no expenses or costs for this transaction.

ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF CHAPTER 5B OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY

WHEREAS, for clarity and consistency Section 1(c) of Chapter 5B of the Code of the City of Gloucester City requires an Amendment; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Gloucester City to Amend this provision; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration and deliberation, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City desire to amend section 1 (c) of Chapter 5B of the Code of the City of Gloucester City

THEREFORE BEING ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Council of the City of Gloucester City, County of Camden, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1(c) of Chapter 5B of the Code of the City of Gloucester City shall be amended to read as follows:

Subject to the limitations of this Ordinance, any entity meeting the definition of "professional business entity" under this section may contribute a maximum of \$1,200.00 per election cycle for any candidate(s) or Gloucester City Party Committee, without violating section 1 (a) of this ordinance. However, any entity meeting the definition of "professional business entity" under this section, including such principals, partners and officers of the entity in the aggregate, may not annually contribute for any purpose, in excess of a total of \$2,400.00 to all Gloucester City candidates and officeholders with ultimate responsibility for the award of a contract.

AN ORDINANCE TO RELEASE, VACATE AND EXTINGUISH ANY AND ALL PUBLIC RIGHTS IN AND TO A PORTION OF BIRCH AVENUE SUBJECT TO CERTAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Gloucester City, is of the opinion that the public interest will best be served by abandoning, vacating, releasing and extinguishing any and all public rights which the City of Gloucester City may have in and to the following described portion of Birch Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Gloucester City, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The public rights and interests in a portion of Birch Avenue, between the southerly line of Market Street and the northerly line of Oriental Avenue, more particularly described in accordance with Exhibit "A" attached hereto, are hereby vacated, abandoned and released.
- 2. The vacation set forth herein expressly reserves and excepts from said vacation, all rights and privileges possessed by any and all public utilities, as defined by R.S. 48:2-13, and by any cable television company, as defined in the Cable Television Act, P.L. 1972, c. 186, (C. 48:5A-1 et seq.), to maintain, repair and replace their existing facilities in adjacent to, over or under the street, highway, lane, alley, square, place or park, or any part thereof, to be vacated.
- 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication as required by law.
