## RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY County of Camden, State of New Jersey #R 106 -2019

RESOLUTION RATIFYING A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY AND FIREMEN'S MUTUAL BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION, LOCAL NO. 51, GLOUCESTER CITY PROFESSIONAL FIREFIGHTERS, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS, FOR THE PERIOD COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 2016 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2020

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City have negotiated, through the City Solicitor, a Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association, Local No. 51, Gloucester City Professional Firefighters, subject to certain terms and conditions for the period covering January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council desire to approve and ratify said Collective Bargaining Agreement and authorize the Mayor to execute the contract between the parties.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City, County of Camden and State of New Jersey, that:

- 1. The provisions of the WHEREAS clauses set forth above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.
- 2. The Mayor and Common Council hereby authorize and ratify a Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of Gloucester City and the Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association, Local No. 51, Gloucester City Professional Firefighters, subject to certain terms and conditions for the period covering January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020, subject to final approval of the City Solicitor as to the final form of said contract.
- 3. The Mayor, Business Administrator and/or Chief Financial Officer are hereby authorized to take any action to achieve the purposes set forth herein.
- 4. The authorization and ratification of the Collective Bargaining Agreement is expressly conditioned upon the adoption of an appropriate and necessary salary ordinance reflecting the fiscal changes set forth within the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
- 5. The Chief Financial Officer shall certify as to the availability of funds and this Resolution shall take effect upon adoption of the salary ordinance identified herein.
