ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY County of Camden, State of New Jersey #O 01 - 2022

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 87 ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC", ARTICLE 1. "STREET TRAFFIC AND PARKING", §87-9. "SCHEDULE B: STOP INTERSECTIONS", AS AUTHORIZED BY N.J.S.A. 39:4-140 AND §87-4, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, this amendment is in the best interest of health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Gloucester City ("City"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Chapter 87, §87-9 by adding and creating additional stop intersections within the City of Gloucester City; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey Statutes 39:4-140 provides the City the authority to set certain permissible stops sign on any highway under their jurisdiction, by Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City desire to amend the Code of the City of Gloucester City, specifically Chapter 87, entitled Vehicles and Traffic, by adding to §87-9, certain additional stop signs. In the interest of public safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City, County of Camden and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1: The following stop intersections are added to Chapter 87, Vehicles and Traffic, §87-9A:

- (44) Stop sign on the southeast corner of King and Monmouth Street.
- (45) Stop sign on the northwest corner of King and Monmouth Street.
- (46) Stop sign on the northeast corner of Jersey Ave and 6th Street.
- (47) Stop sign on the southwest corner of Jersey Ave and 6th Street.
- (48) Cold Springs Drive (all will be facing traffic traveling north), stop sign at the northeast corner of the northernmost entrance to the parking lot of Cold Springs School (horseshoe driveway which is approximately 250 south of Market Street).
- (49) Cold Springs Drive (all will be facing traffic traveling north), stop sign at the northeast corner of the northernmost entrance to the parking lot of Cold Springs School (horseshoe driveway (which is approximately 350 south of Market Street).

Section 2: Delete item (36) to Chapter 87, Vehicles and Traffic, §87-9A.

Section 3: Add to Chapter 87. Vehicles and Traffic, Article I. Street Traffic and Parking, the follows:

§ 87-5.2 EMERGENCY NO PARKING.

- (A) Posting of signs.
- (1) Upon the declaration of an emergency, there shall be no parking upon streets or sections of streets where temporary emergency no-parking signs are displayed. The Chief of Police or, in his absence, the ranking police officer is authorized to declare an emergency and to direct the posting of the emergency no-parking signs when weather conditions, accidents, fires or public celebrations dictate or require the avoidance of hazards or other conditions which interfere with the free flow of traffic.
- (2) Notification that the emergency no-parking signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle which has been parked prior to the posting of the signs.
- § 87-5.3 REMOVAL OF VEHICLES. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this section shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic, and any peace officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal, before regaining possession of the vehicle.
- § 87-5.4 EFFECTIVENESS OF SECTION. The effectiveness of this section is contingent on signs being erected as required by law.
- <u>Section 4</u>: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- <u>Section 5</u>: If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.
- Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY County of Camden, State of New Jersey **#O 02 - 2022**

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER CITY, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY CREATING A MERCANTILE LICENSE PROCESS

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to create a Mercantile Licensing process for certain businesses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of

Gloucester City, County of Camden and State of New Jersey as follows:
SECTION: 1
Chapter Licensing Procedures
Article II. Mercantile Licenses
§1 License required.
No person or business entity shall engage in or carry on any business, trade or calling in the City of Gloucester City or aid or assist an employee, clerk or otherwise in carrying on such business or in using any stand, store or other place or thing or sell or offer for sale any goods or things for which a license is required by the terms of this article, unless a license as herein provided for shall have been first obtained therefor by said person or business entity engaging in said business, trade or calling.
§2. Application for license.
An application for a license shall be obtained from the Municipal Licensing Officer of the City of Gloucester City, Gloucester, New Jersey, and the application for a license, when completed

shall specifically name the person, firm or entity to which the license is to be granted and the location at which such business or occupation is to be carried on. The application, when completed, shall further provide detailed information respecting such person, firm or entity and said business or occupation.

§ ____-3. Submission to Planning Board; application deadline.

A. All new businesses shall submit the completed application to the Municipal Licensing Officer of the City of Gloucester City, who shall, where appropriate, forward this application to the Planning Board of the City of Gloucester City, at which time investigation shall be made, as deemed necessary by the Planning Board of the City of Gloucester City. The Planning Board of the City of Gloucester City may conduct a hearing respecting said application and shall forward any recommendations respecting said application to the Common Council of the City of Gloucester City. No mercantile license shall be issued except pursuant to the authorization of the Common Council of the City of Gloucester City.

B. All persons, firms or entities presently in existence and required to be licensed in the City of Gloucester City shall apply for such license prior to July 1, 2022.

§ _____-4. Renewal license fees; expiration.

All renewal license fees shall be due and payable to the Municipal Licensing Officer of the City of Gloucester City at his office in the City of Gloucester City, New Jersey, on the first day of July of each year, and all such licenses shall expire on the last day of June following such payment.

§ ____-5. Fees.

The license fees of fifty (\$50) dollars shall be paid biennially (once every two years), as above provided, to the City of Gloucester City for conducting any businesses, trades, professions or occupations at the places designated in the license certificate issued therefor.

§ _____-6. Nonapplicability of license.

No person or persons shall be allowed to transact any business under any license granted under this article except the business for which said license was specifically granted.

§ ____-7. Compliance with regulations; revocation of license; nontransferability.

A. No license shall be issued to any person or entity which has not complied with the laws of the State of New Jersey or the ordinances of the City of Gloucester City providing regulations respecting the safety of the persons who may have occasion to use the premises, place or thing licensed, and in case any person licensed fails to comply with such laws and ordinances after due notice and opportunity to be heard, the City Common Council may revoke such license.

B. No license provided for by this article shall be transferred from one person to another person, and no license shall cover any other place of business than that for which it was issued.

§ ____-8. Nonapplicability of provisions.

A. This article shall not apply to orders taken out of this City or to soliciting of orders by wholesale dealers from retail dealers or to deliveries by wholesale dealers to retail dealers or to the sale or delivery of newspapers, magazines or periodicals.

B. This article shall not apply to any corporation authorized to transact business by the Department of Banking and Insurance of the State of New Jersey or to any corporation authorized to transact business by any department of the government of the United States or to

ORDINANCE TO EXEEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government "CAP" Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City in the County of Camden finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY2022 budget up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council hereby determines that a 2.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$442,937.43 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government "CAP" Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City, in the County of Camden, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Gloucester City shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$620,112.40, and that the CY2022 municipal budget for the City of Gloucester City be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.
