OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING-SHARED
SERVICES AGREEMENT AMONG GLOUCESTER CITY, COLLINGWOOD, CAMDEN CITY,
BELLMAWR FIRE DEPARTMENT, WESTVILLE AND CHERRY HILL FIRE DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, the Gloucester City Fire Department, ("Gloucester City"), Westville Fire District, ("Westville"), Collingswood Fire Department ("Collingswood") Camden City Fire Department ("Camden City"), Bellmawr Fire Department ("Bellmawr") and Cherry Hill Fire District ("Cherry Hill"), (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Departments") seek to amend the award amount due to a grant not being fully funded under the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program (AFG) FY 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Departments desire to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding-Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement") with Gloucester City for the purposes of dispensing funds through the Department of Homeland Security ("DHS"), Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program ("AFG") FY 2021, for Training ("RIT/RIC") and equipment under a Regional Grant, EMW-2021-FG-09752, in the total amount of \$98,058.96; \$89,144.50, of which is the federal share and \$8,914.46 is the applicant share; and

WHEREAS, each Department's share will be detailed in an attachment to be affixed to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the original Memorandum of Understanding-Shared Services Agreement dated December 15, 2021, will remain in full force and effect, except for the funding amount set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, the proper and respective municipal officials were authorized to execute this Shared Services Agreement pursuant to Resolutions of their respective Governing Bodies which are attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Departments are permitted in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (“Act”), to enter into an Agreement to provide jointly, or through each respective agency itself, such services authorized by the Act, including areas of general government administration, such as shared services and the like.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that City Council of the City of Gloucester City hereby agree as follows:

1. The provisions of the WHEREAS clauses set forth above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.
2. The Mayor and City Clerk, or their designee shall take any and all actions necessary to execute a Shared Services Agreement and carry out any and all actions authorized therein, by and between the Departments as set forth herein and said Agreement is hereby approved in a form substantially similar to that attached hereto and made a part hereof
3. The Department agree that each Department’s relative share shall be detailed in an attachment affixed to the Agreement; and
4. The subject Memorandum of Understanding-Shared Services Agreement shall be filed, for informational purposes, with the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, pursuant to rules and regulations promulgated by the Director.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE MAILING OF
2023 THIRD QUARTER ESTIMATED TAX BILLS

WHEREAS, the annual budget for the City of Gloucester City, the City of Gloucester City School Board and/or the County of Camden has not been finally set; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Gloucester City has therefore determined that the City Tax Collector will be unable to complete the mailing and delivery of municipal tax bills by **June 30, 2023**; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3 provides the authority and procedures by which an estimated and reconciled tax bill can be set and mailed by a municipality in such case made, by **June 30, 2023** of the said year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Gloucester City as follows:

1. The Tax Collector in consultation with the Chief Finance Officer (CFO) of the City of Gloucester City shall compute an estimated annual tax levy range for the County and each taxing district whose tax levy has not yet been certified by the County Board of Taxation, which as of this date; such levies have not been so certified.
2. The range may be within the lower and upper amounts calculated by multiplying the levy of the County and each such taxing district for the previous calendar year by 0.95 and 1.05.
3. The City CFO has prepared, delivered, and recommends to the governing body a Certification of the previous calendar fiscal year's annual tax levy with a multiplier of 1.05 to determine an estimated annual tax levy for the County and each such taxing district for the current year.
4. The governing body hereby authorizes the CFO, working in conjunction with the Tax Collector, by **June 30, 2023** to prepare and deliver estimated annual tax levy bills for the County and each such taxing district computed by utilizing the multiplier of 1.05 of the previous calendar fiscal year annual tax levy, and thereafter, to be administered in accordance with the procedures and standards as established by N.J.S.A 54: 4-66.3.

WHEREAS, there is a need for a Memorandum of Understanding between the County of Camden (Department of Public Works), and the City of Gloucester for the facilitation of safe and efficient management of traffic flow at various intersections along Broadway (CR 551) which are listed in the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) New Jersey Traffic Signal Retiming Initiative Concept of Operations (ConOps) day to day operations; and

WHEREAS, the County of Camden (Department of Public Works) and the City of Gloucester are partnering to develop a regional traffic signal retiming initiative project for various intersections along Broadway (CR 551) listed in the New Jersey Traffic Signal Retiming Initiative ConOps; and

WHEREAS, the Camden County Board of Commissioners has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the County of Camden to authorize a Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Gloucester for the purpose stated above; now,

**ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO
ESTABLISH A CAP BANK PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14**

WHEREAS, the Local Government "CAP" Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City in the County of Camden finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY2023 budget up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council hereby determines that a 2.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$484,081.03 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government "CAP" Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City, in the County of Camden, with a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that in the CY2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Gloucester City shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$677,713.44 and that the CY2023 municipal budget for the City of Gloucester City be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced, be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adoption.

**ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 87, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, ARTICLE I,
ENTITLED STREET TRAFFIC AND PARKING, § 87-18. A, HEAVY VEHICLES RESTRICTED
TO TRUCK ROUTES; EXCEPTIONS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER,
COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, this amendment is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Gloucester City ("City"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Chapter 87, specifically §87-18 by DELETING Johnson Boulevard from the list of accepted streets for truck routes within the City as recommended by the Gloucester City Police Department; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey Statutes provides the City the authority to set certain permissible street regulations on any highway under its jurisdiction by Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City desire to amend the Code of the City of Gloucester City, specifically Chapter 87, entitled Heavy Vehicle Restricted to Truck Routes; Exceptions, as set forth in §87-18.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Ordained by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Gloucester City, County of Camden and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1: The following street is hereby deleted as acceptable as part of the City's truck routes set forth in §87-18:

Section 2: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3: If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
